


Y12s at the Centre for Sight in EG, shoulder to shoulder with one of the foremost ophthalmic surgeons in the world. What a great experience.

Several of our long serving governors generously renewed their commitment to the school with a further term of office during this term. We also welcomed two new governors. Mrs Carole Lane has been a regular contributor to the Parents' Forum and following a Parent Governor election, we had the pleasure of welcoming Julian Hollingsworth. We wish them both well as they start 4 years as Imberhorne's newest governors.

The Finance committee has had a busy term. Imberhorne is not immune from the very testing financial pressures that all schools have been enduring. We were able to set a balanced budget in May for the coming year, acknowledging that it will generate some difficult choices as the year progresses. Governors have supported several innovative fundraising initiatives in response, in order to provide some extra help with spending. We are most grateful to all those parents who have responded with support and especially with generous contributions to the school fund. We are also very pleased to welcome many groups, societies and organisations onto our site to use our facilities and to help generate very useful revenue from lettings. The School Improvement Plan developed 3 years ago comes to a conclusion this summer. A new plan looking to the future is being developed and governors will be more involved than previously in its progress.

Working parties of governors have been spending time in school during this term meeting students and staff in the classroom. We are always impressed by the welcome and helpfulness of our students during these important fact-finding visits. We embarked upon a successful tendering process for the grounds maintenance contract renewal in June. We now look forward to a rewarding working relationship with our new grounds contractors, TEM who will start maintaining our grounds and open spaces from September.

It is the chairperson's most pleasurable duty to judge and award the Ann Bolt Shield at the graduation ceremony at the beginning of the summer term. This prize is awarded for the best Record of Achievement and is always hotly contested with amazing accounts of experiences and accomplishments. This year I was delighted to make the award to Victoria Bramley and also to acknowledge the very deserving runners-up.

Many governors participated in this year's I-Fest, greeting our visitors and staffing the tea and cake stall. It was another

great event for the school. I hope many of you had the opportunity to be part of it and to enjoy the evening.

On behalf of all governors, I would like to wish everyone a long and restful summer. I look forward to seeing you all in September when the school celebrates 60 years at Imberhorne Lane!
