I know that arrangements have not always been perfect but we have tried to adapt and change according to your feedback. We want the very best for everyone but appreciate the obstacles that exist for some.

I wish you all good health and good cheer over the long weekend. I am taking a break from the regular Joe Wicks workouts that we do in school with the small number of students who currently attend. I amuse them if nothing else!
