



| Year 10 | <p>Paper 1 - Medicine through time <i>Life in the Trenches (Section A, covered in Year 9)</i> 1250 - 1500, Medieval Medicine 1500 - 1700, Renaissance Medicine 1700 - 1900, Medicine in 18th and 19th century Britain 1900 - Present, Medicine in Modern times</p>  <p>A study of the change, continuity and progress made through the four time periods. We will look at key individuals and institutions, attitudes in society and scientific discoveries. We will see how they impacted beliefs in the causes of disease, how people were cared for and treated and methods of prevention</p> | <p>Paper 3 - Weimar and Nazi Germany <i>The Weimar Republic, 1918 - 1929</i> <i>Hitler's rise to power, 1919 - 1933</i> <i>Nazi control and dictatorship, 1933 - 1939</i> <i>Life in Nazi Germany, 1933 - 1939</i></p>  <p>A modern depth study that charts the birth of a new Republic, it's difficulties and its Golden Age. | Year 11 | <p>Paper 2 - Superpower relations and the Cold War 1941-1991 <i>The origins of the Cold War, 1941-58</i> <i>Cold War crises, 1958-70</i> <i>The end of the Cold War, 1970-91</i></p>  <p>A study looking at a significant time period in shaping the modern world, charting a series of events highlighting the mistrust and tensions between two superpowers. Why the USA and the Soviet Union became locked in a deadly battle of words; how close the world came to nuclear catastrophe; what was really going on in the minds of leaders from Stalin to Kennedy, Reagan to Gorbachev.</p> <p>Note - the December mock exam will be Paper 3</p> | <p>Paper 2 - Early Elizabethan England <i>Queen, Government and Religion, 1558 - 1569</i> <i>Challenges to Elizabeth at home and abroad, 1569 - 1588</i> <i>Elizabethan Society and the age of Exploration, 1558 -1588</i></p>  <p>A depth study focusing on the challenges of Elizabeth I's reign. From her immediate problems of foreign powers, domestic issues and religion; through to the start of England's emergence as a powerful country with defeat of the Spanish Armada and establishment of colonies.</p> |
