






Why are flashcards useful?

- ✓ Easy way to record information

- ✓ Use them to test yourself
- ✓ Great for knowledge retention


What can you put on them?

- Case studies




Top tip 2:




Top tip 3:

- Make them eye catching by using colours, symbols and pictures as well as key words.




How to make flash cards step 1:

- This will ensure you cover the whole topic and don't miss anything out!




How to make flash cards step 2:

- Get an index card
- Consider using different colours for different topics



How to make flash cards step 3:




Use your notes, textbooks

Remember:


- Don't have too much information on one card
- Make sure you put a question/heading on one side and then the information on another
- Make sure you follow your plan so you include everything for each topic

And finally...once you have made the flashcards

- Put them in order and use a treasury tag/elastic band/paper clip to keep them organised
- Keep them in a folder so you don't lose them!
