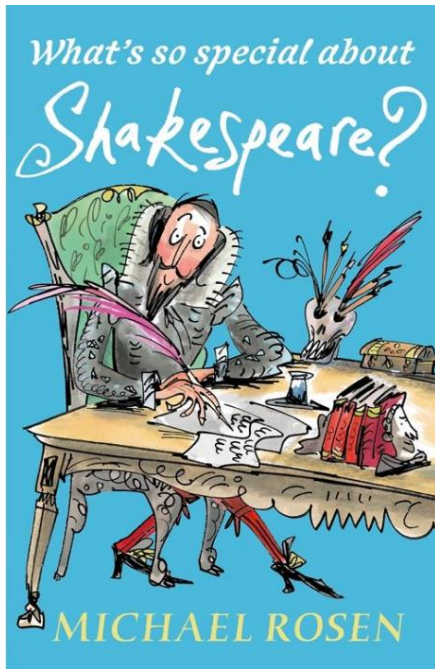

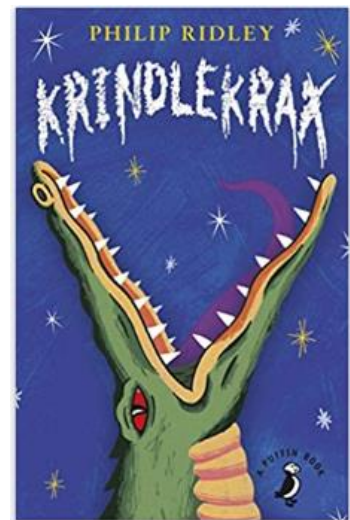


What's So Special About Shakespeare?

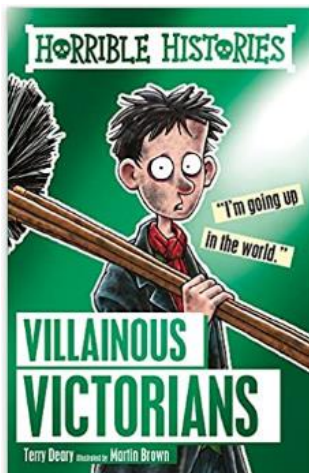
