Dear Parents and Carers

In the morning:



- Metrobus 643, 642, 624, Crawley Luxury 903, Turbostyle E579, Vision Travel, Lingfield Minibuses call at Imberhorne Lane
- Metrobus 638 and 648 stop at the Felbridge Hotel, students will need to walk to the Imberhorne Lane site using the pedestrian crossing
- Southdown 236 service from Dormansland and Lingfield stop on the Lingfield Road opposite the park at Lower School and students walk to Imberhorne Lane

In the afternoon:

- Metrobus 642, 643, 624, Crawley Luxury 903, Turbostyle E579, Vision Travel, Lingfield Minibuses call at Imberhorne Lane
- Metrobus 638 and 648 stop at the bus stop near the BP station (London Road) students walk to get the service at 3.23pm
- Students needing to get back to Dormansland and Lingfield walk back to Lower School to board the Southdown 236 service at 3.15 or the 409 service at 3.42pm

Thursday 21st July Transport Arrangements

As you know the school year finishes on Thursday 21st July at 12.20pm. Bus services on that day are as follows:

Metrobus services

- Metrobus services 638, 648, 643, call in on both sites as normal at 12.20pm.
- Metrobus service 281 will operate but the stops are Gardenwood Road 13.15pm and Felbridge Hotel at 13.21pm
- Metrobus service 291 will operate calling at the London Road stop near the Lingfield Roundabout at 12.44pm and continues to Felbridge for 12.51pm
- Metrobus 84 will operate from East Grinstead Station at 12.39pm travelling back to West Hoathly and Sharpthorne
- Metrobus 624 -will not operate at this time so students travelling to Smallfield and Horley will need to make other arrangements.

Coaches and Taxis

The following coach and mini bus services will operate their normal routes calling at both sites:

• 903, 905, E579 Turbostyle, E636 Vision Travel, Lingfield Minibus.

Southdown services

Southdown service 236 – will operate at 13.42pm for students going back to Lingfield and Dormansland calling the stop opposite Lower School.
