I am pleased to report that rates of Covid infection appear to be stable, whilst not decreasing significantly they are also not increasing. We continue to monitor what is happening.

Updated guidance from the Department of Health and Social Care as of Friday 1st April is as follows:

 children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend

 adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days

The advice continues as follows, 'the population now has much stronger protection against COVID-19 than at any other point in the pandemic. This means we can begin to manage the virus like other respiratory infections, thanks to the success of the vaccination programme and access to antivirals, alongside natural immunity and increased scientific and public understanding about how to manage risk.'

We retain a number of LFD tests at school. If your son or daughter is unwell we can provide an LFD test for their use, if the test result is positive we expect students to follow the above advice and isolate for three days during the most infectious period.

<u>Assessment</u>

Assessing students work and helping them make progress through appropriate and targeted feedback is an important part of what teachers do.
