Attendance

Good attendance is essential for students to get the most out of their school experience. Good attendance improves results, wellbeing, and wider life chances. Student attendance is directly linked to success at school – with significantly higher results for those with higher rates of attendance.

- Students not achieving grade 9 to 4 in English and Maths had an attendance of 91%
- Students achieving grade 9 to 4 in English and Maths had an attendance of 95%
- Students achieving at least Grade 5 in English and Maths had an attendance of 96%
