Dear Parents and Carers

Today is the final day of term, we are pleased to have reached this end point with so little disruption to learning. We have felt challenged in all sorts of ways in the period since September, particularly over the last few weeks against a backdrop of rising infection rates in the locality. We have tried to balance the delivery of a rounded education with the need to keep everyone, students, staff and families safe. We hope we have managed this appropriately.

You may be aware of the government announcement, made Thursday afternoon, about changes to the start of the Spring Term. On Wednesday we received notification about an intensive testing programme that schools are expected to establish in January to help identify positive cases of Covid-19 in our community. To facilitate this, the announcement on Thursday informed us that there will be a delay to the start of the Spring Term for most students. What we understand, at this stage, is that students in Year 11 and Year 13 will return to school on Monday 4th January. All other year groups will start online learning from this date with a view to returning to school on Monday 11th January. We are awaiting further details, but wanted to give you as much notice as possible about this proposed change. If families are classified as 'key workers', generally this means working in medical or social care, and require a school place for your son or daughter in the first week of January, please contact Mrs Timson (KS3) httmson@imberhorne.co.uk and Mr D Jones (KS4) diones@imberhorne.co.uk.

Please continue to keep us informed of any matters we should know about over the Christmas period. If your son or daughter tests positive, either at the start or end of the holiday period, this may have an impact on the school and we will need to be informed. In some instances, we may have to subsequently contact other students and families. I am providing a simple table below to clarify our expectations.

Date my son/daughter first had symptoms and/or took a test (that was later returned as positive)	Should I notify the school
Saturday 19 th December	Yes – because when we count back
Sunday 20 th December	48 hrs it is term time
Monday 21st December	No
Within 10 days of the start of lessons (4th or	Yes – students may not be able to
