Dear Parents, Carers and Students

I am writing with regards to results day in the summer. This is due to take place for Year 13 students on Thursday 13th August.

Results will be available for students to collect at school from 8.00am. We will have four distribution points outside the Di Gasson studio to ensure results are distributed as quickly and as safely as possible. Results that have not been collected will be made available electronically to students at 10.00am, students should check their school emails on results day for notification of this, paper copies will also be posted.

We are of course very conscious that everything continues to be different at present, this unfortunately must apply to results day as well.

In keeping with current guidance, I wanted to make you aware that teaching staff will not to be present on results day. Whilst they would very much like to be there we must reduce contact and avoid people gathering in groups. You are aware that grades have been awarded in a different way this year, we have had to enter into a confidentiality agreement with exam boards and therefore cannot discuss the process or decisions we have made. We are aware that adjustments may be made by the exam boards to ensure that nationally, grades are broadly in line with those awarded in previous years. This standardisation process takes place every year but with grades and marks that we do not see prior to publication. As we have communicated to you previously we cannot, therefore, be sure that the grades we have awarded will be the grades students receive.

Members of the Sixth Form pastoral team will be present on the morning of results day and are able to offer advice and guidance for students, if required, in a socially distanced way. We will operate a booking system for Friday 14th August to ensure everyone has a designated time for further discussions if required. If students are awarded grades that they feel do not represent the level they are capable of there will be an opportunity to take exams in the Autumn period. A full range of exams will be available.









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If a student has concerns about the awarding of their grade and believe an error has been made it is possible to make an appeal. There are two routes for this. Advice from Ofqual about appeals this year is as follows:

1. Students will be able to appeal their grades – through their school – if they believe the process this summer was not followed correctly in their case. This will result in an examination of our internal school processes to ensure appropriate procedures have been followed.

2. A centre may appeal to the exam board if it believes the centre itself made an error when submitting a centre assessment grade or rank order information or if it believes an exam board made a mistake when calculating, assigning or communicating a grade. An appeal will result in a re-checking of school data to ensure no errors were made when data was submitted to the exam board.
