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



#### Intervention and Independent Study

- Intervention does and will take a number of different forms:
  - Additional sessions (lunchtimes, after school etc)
  - Targeted tasks in class or for homework focused on gaps in knowledge
  - Specific revision resources provided
  - Students removed from non assessed lessons to work in small groups
- We will look at the data from each assessment and reporting point to make decisions about which students need specific intervention at each stage
- Parents will be kept informed if their child has a specific subject(s) that we feel they need more support in than others



# How will we Support Students to be Independent Learners?

- 9<sup>th</sup> November: Elevate Study Skills running workshops for students
- Revision and study skills to be taught in PD lessons and reviewed in tutor time and subject lessons
- 17<sup>th</sup> February: parents and students invited to come in together for revision skills workshops so you can work as a team at home

# What Should Students do to Help Themselves?


- Commit to the learning that happens in each lesson
- Recognise how close we are to the exams and the sooner they begin their independent revision the more confident they will feel
- Design a revision timetable & follow it
- Find a quiet and dedicated place to study and avoid distractions
- Little and often
- Keep it active and varied


