KS3 Sports Day

Year 7, 8 and 9 students should come to school in PE kit on Monday 10th July for Sports Day. **This takes place at our Upper School site from 8.30am.** Students must not go to Lower School on Monday.

Year 10 Careers Interview Day

This takes place on Monday 10th July. Students will have interviews with a range of employers to follow on from their Work Experience last week, and to provide the opportunity for them to market their skills and talents in an interview situation. They will also have sessions designed to build their team working skills. On Tuesday, students in Year 10 will either be visiting the University of Sussex for a Taster Day, or taking part in the Albion Inspires programme in school to focus on their aspirations for further education and employment.

WhatsApp

We are aware that some students in Year 7 are using WhatsApp to set up group chats for their tutor groups. If your child is on one of these groups, we would advise you to ensure they leave the group, and if your child is admin of one of these groups, we ask that the group is closed. This is in order to fulfil our duty to keep our students safe. Social Media does not provide the best training for young people to navigate social situations, and messages can be hurtful and unkind.

Please be advised that the minimum age of use for WhatsApp is 16. Students should also be aware that in group chats, people who are not in their contacts will be able to see all the messages and send them messages. If your child is 16 or over and uses WhatsApp to communicate, please talk to them to ensure that the content, security measures and messages are appropriate.
