Dear Parents and Carers

This has been a busy week of visiting lessons, undertaking mock interviews with students applying to Oxford or Cambridge, meeting Year 11 students for their Futures interviews and hearing about the plans for Duke of Edinburgh Bronze, Silver and Gold challenges in the year ahead. I saw some incredibly professional looking pizzas being made, heard a discussion on utilitarianism, and quizzed a range of students about their future plans. It is always an absolute privilege and pleasure to experience the rich and varied curriculum your children have at Imberhorne first hand.

We are looking forward to welcoming families to our Sixth Form Open Evening on Thursday. You can visit between 4.30 and 7.30 to experience for yourselves the array of subjects available in Year 12 and 13, the superb pastoral care and wide-ranging extra-curricular opportunities on offer. Please remember that next Thursday is a compressed day and will finish for students at 2.30pm.

Travel arrangements have been made as follows for students who catch school coaches/buses and taxis:

- School coach service **903**, **905**, **E579** and all taxis/minibuses are able to collect students at their relevant sites at 2.30pm.
- The following Metrobus services will also run their usual route: **638**, **643**, **648**, **281** at this time. Please note that the **624** and **84** services <u>cannot</u> operate at **2.30pm** and will therefore run as a normal school day finish.
- Southdown PSV service **236** service will run at its normal scheduled time at 3.15pm as there is not an earlier service available to Lingfield/Dormansland.

Parents/carers are also welcome to collect their son/daughter if they wish at 2.30pm.

If your child is in Key Stage 3, they will have completed their STAR reading test and will be accessing the library at Windmill Lane during an English lesson to read and take quizzes on Accelerated Reader. They can also complete these quizzes at home via the school website. This is an excellent scheme which enables students to read a novel and then earn points for their form by successfully completing a quiz once they have finished. Please encourage your child, whether they are in Key Stage 3 or higher up the school, to develop a 'reading habit' – to take time each day to read their library book and to talk to you about what they are reading. This pays huge dividends in the future – for their academic success, employability and to widen their appreciation of the world.
