Dear Parents and Carers

Firstly this week, I want to congratulate our 'Imberstar' winners. Staff nominate students who have demonstrated praiseworthy activities across the whole of the half term for the Imberstar Award, and Heads of Year choose the 10 students from those who have received the most nominations. There are Imberhorne-themed prizes, skip the queue passes and vouchers for our school canteen as rewards, along with the presentation of a certificate marking the achievement. I met each of the award winners during tutor time and it was a real pleasure to share in their successes.

I am extremely proud of the way our students have responded to the heightened behaviour standards this half term. For every negative behaviour point so far this term, 5 positive points have been awarded. This shows how well the vast majority conduct themselves in school. Well done to all students who have received a praise email, phone call home, certificate celebrating the number of merits they have secured, or a reward for representing the school. ## The Half Term Ahead

Please can I ask you speak to your child about the following points before they return to school following the Half Term break.
