Dear Parents and Carers

This week's letter begins with a message from Mr Yule, Chair of Governors:

I thought you might like to know that, at our meeting just before half-term, the governors had a substantial discussion about school culture.

We focussed on the part of our vision for the school that says, "we will enable all young people, regardless of background, to achieve the highest possible standards of academic excellence, personal conduct and responsibility..." and reflected on how that impacts day-to-day running of the school.

In particular, we are very conscious that current efforts to improve behaviour, whilst welcomed by many, have encountered substantial resistance from a small fraction of students, reflected in higher rates of suspensions than Imberhorne has historically experienced and a handful of permanent exclusions.

We are, however, convinced that the drive to ensure that school rules are enforced consistently will be beneficial for the vast majority of students, who deserve the opportunity to learn without disruption caused by others.

In practice that means that all staff will continue to be encouraged to calmly, but firmly, insist that all students follow the rules; so, for example, mobile phones are never used in school, uniform is worn correctly in line with policy and students behave respectfully towards all other students and adults (and vice-versa).

As you are probably aware, we are currently in the process of appointing a new Headteacher with interviews to be held on Monday 4th and Tuesday 5th March.

We intend to appoint someone who appreciates our commitment to high standards and will want to build on current initiatives when they join us in September.

Students in Years 7, 8 and 9 have had First Aid training this week, including information on CPR and the opportunity to practise this vital skill on their very own 'Resusci-Annie' dummies.
